5. What happens to the first covenant when the second covenant is established?

Personal Thought Questions:

- 1. Verse 10 talks about God's law being written on our hearts and us being God's people. Ezekiel 11:18-21 tells us what it looks like to have a new heart from God and to be God's people. Has *your* heart/ life been cleansed of the "detestable things and all its abominations" and do *you* "walk in [God's] statues and keep [His] ordinances and do them"?
- 2. Verse 11 tells us that everyone, who is a citizen, knows God. 1 John 2:3-6 tells us how we can know if we "know Him" and if we are abiding "in Him." By John's definition, do *you* know God? If not, what command is keeping *you* from knowing God and abiding in Him?
